Commissionaires (formerly known as The Corps of Commissionaires) is a non-profit Canadian security organization that provides security guards. It was established in 1925 and modeled after the British Corps of Commissionaires (which has since become a for-profit entity). Part of the mission of the various Corps organizations was to provide employment to veterans returning from war. Providing employment for veterans of the Canadian Armed Forces, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and their families is still part of Commissionaires' mandate. Today, Commissionaires employs 22,000 people, of whom 5,000 (23%) are veterans. Before today, were you aware of the history of Commissionaires?
