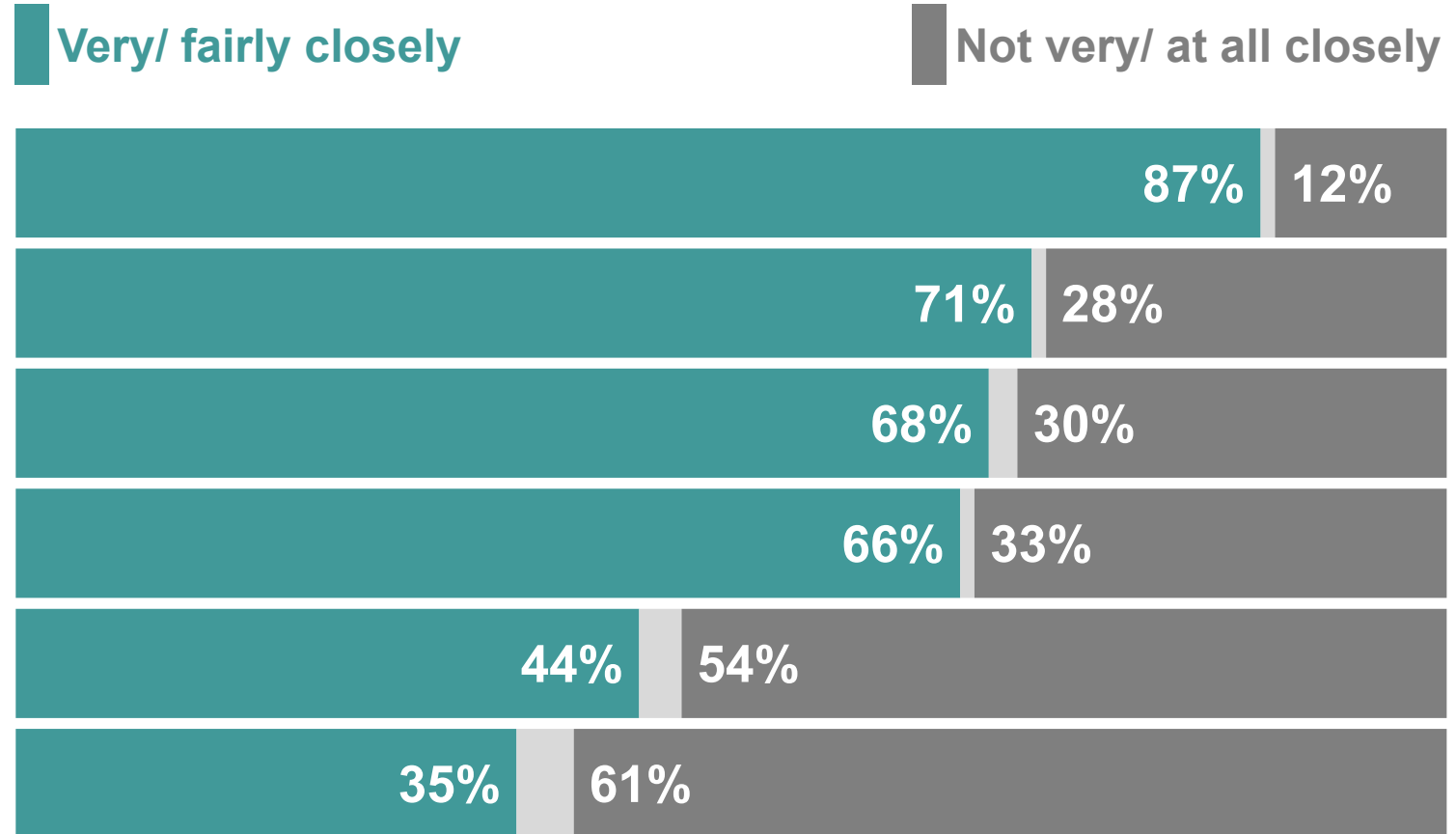

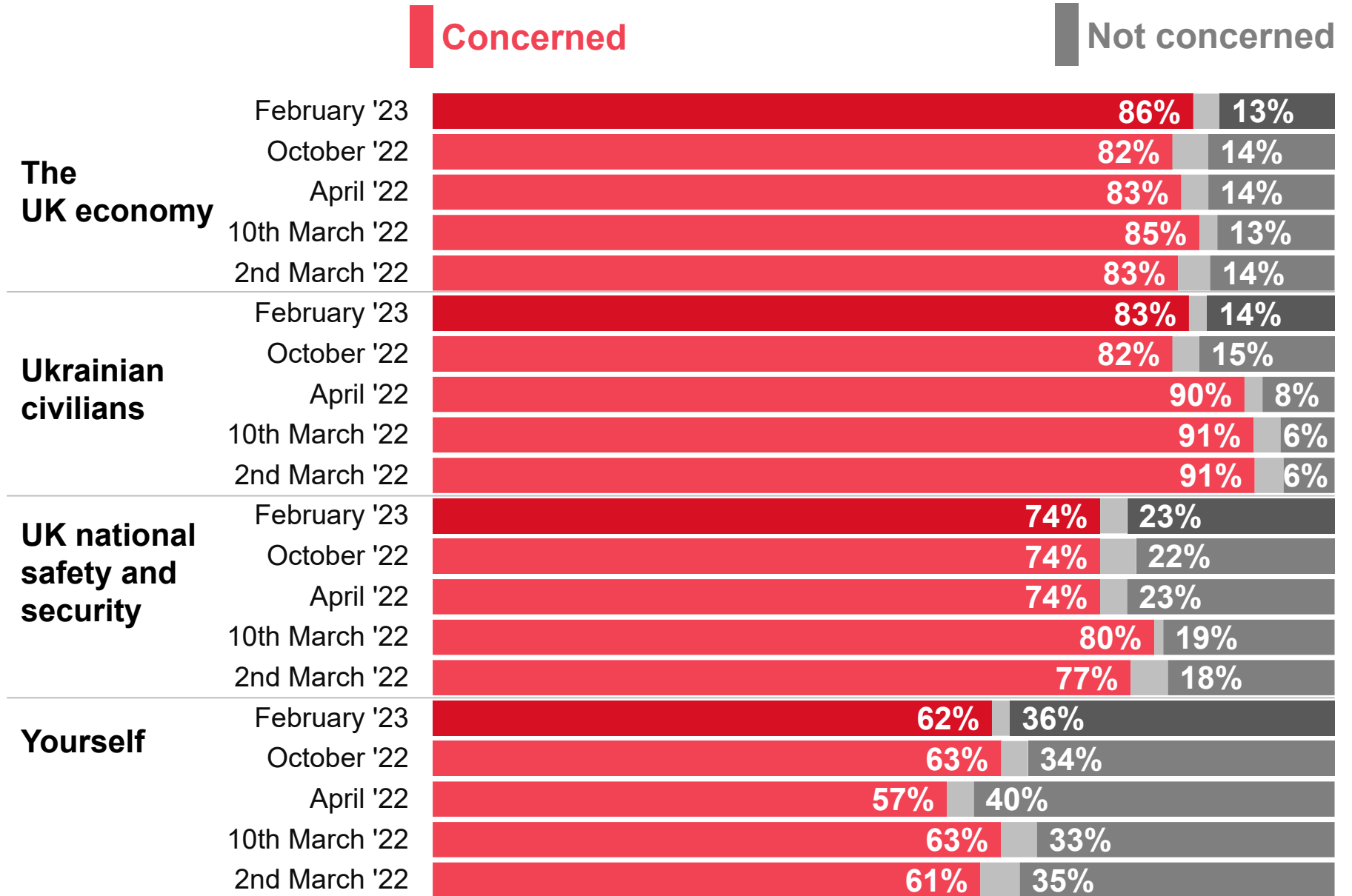
How closely, if at all, have you been following stories about...?

To what extent, if at all, would you say you are concerned about the impact of the Russian invasion of Ukraine on...?

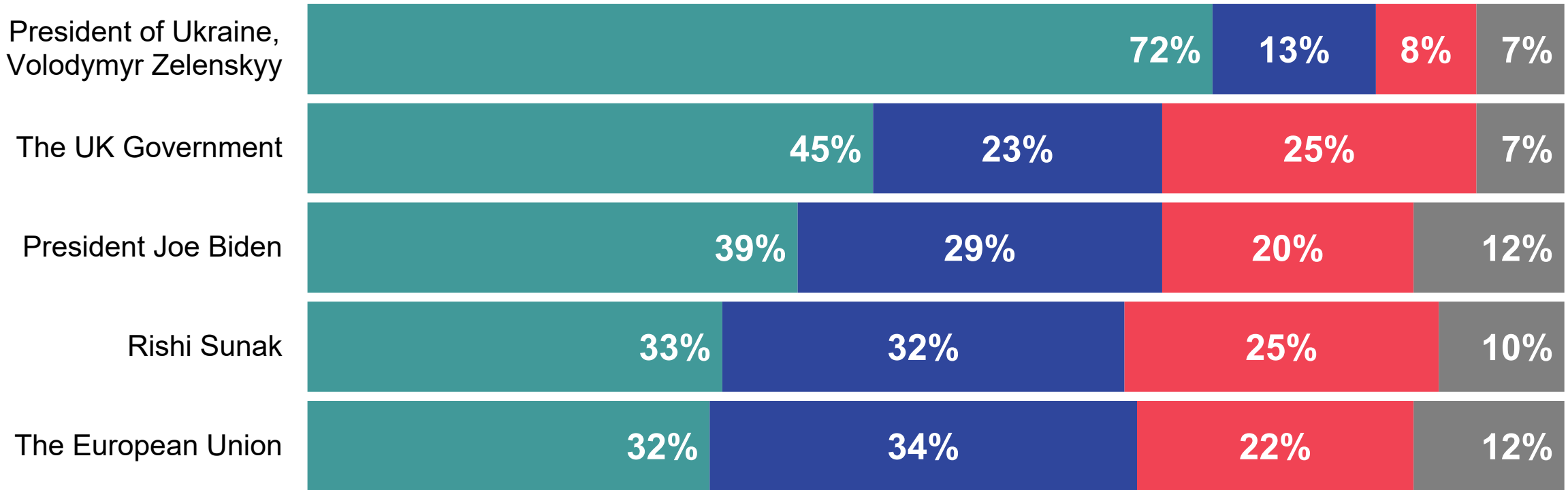

**Good job**   **Neither**   **Bad job**   **Don't know**

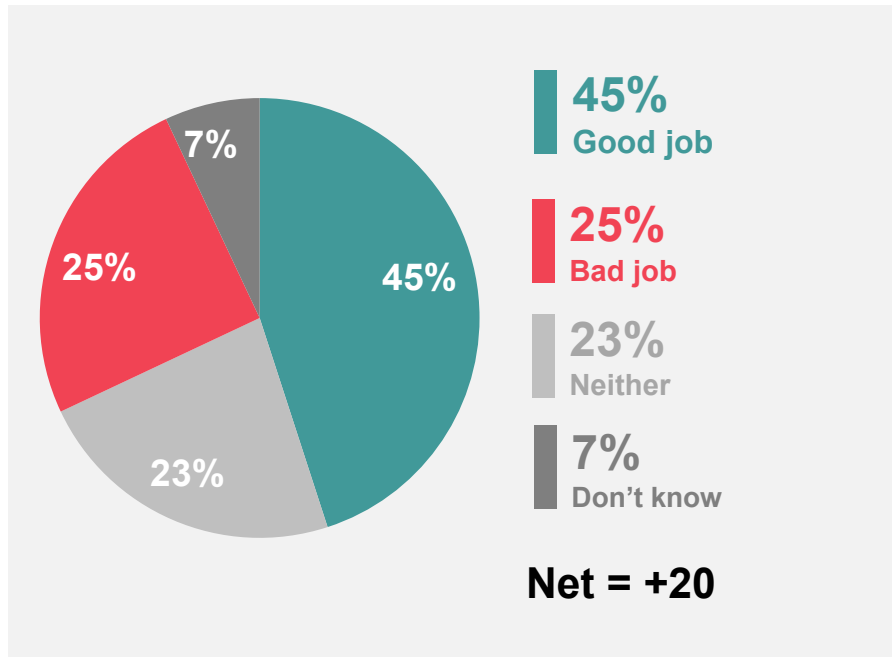

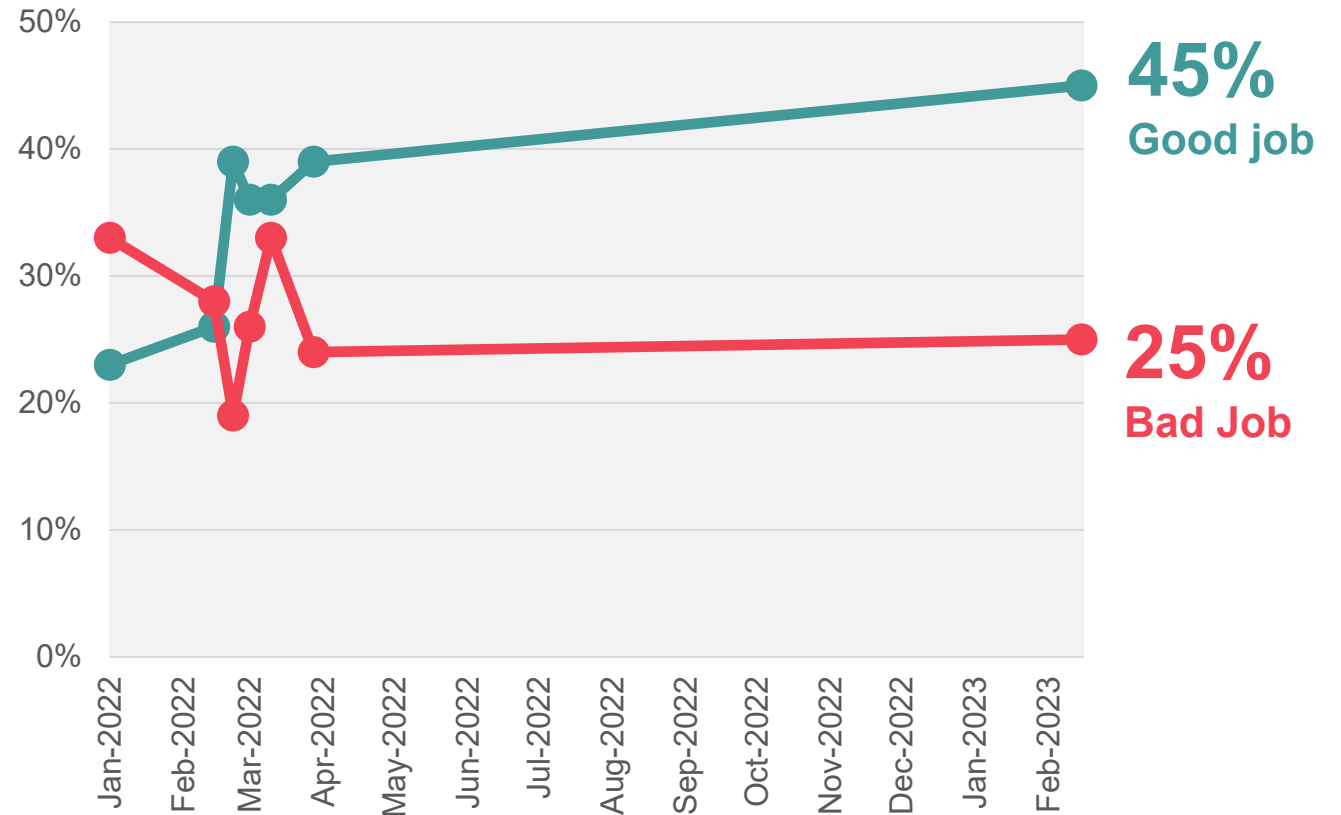

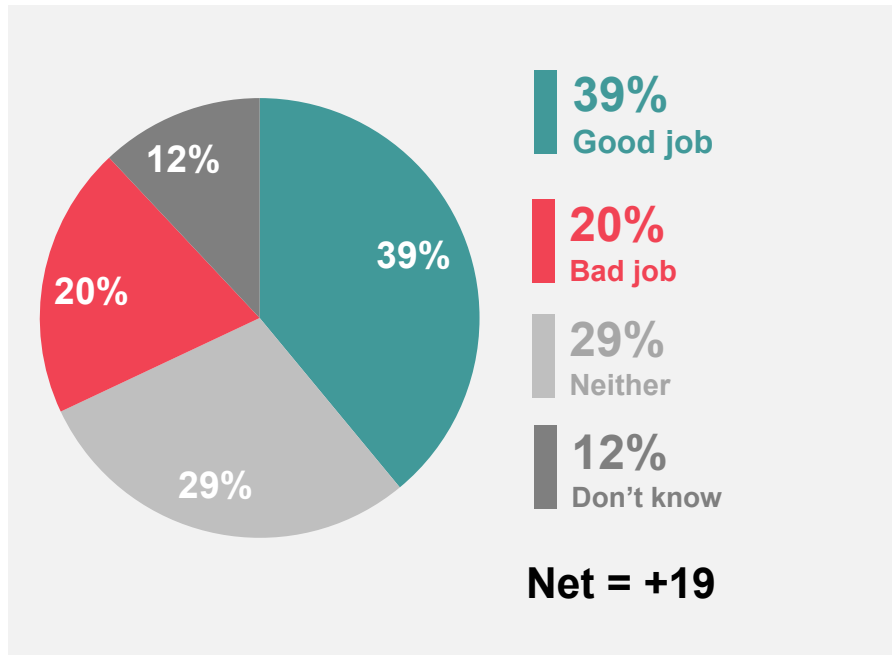

To what extent, if at all, do you think each of the following has done a good or bad job handling the Russian invasion of Ukraine?\* President Joe Biden

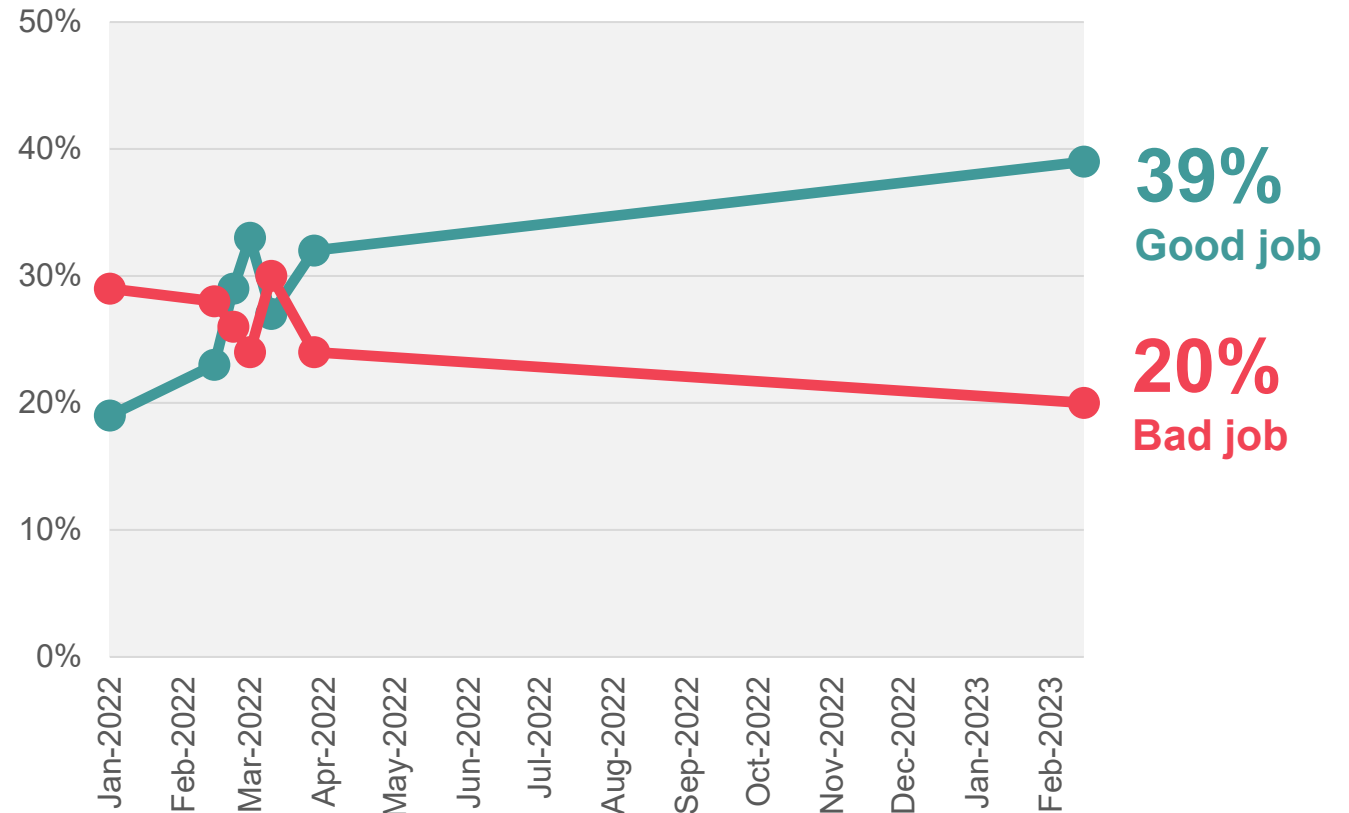

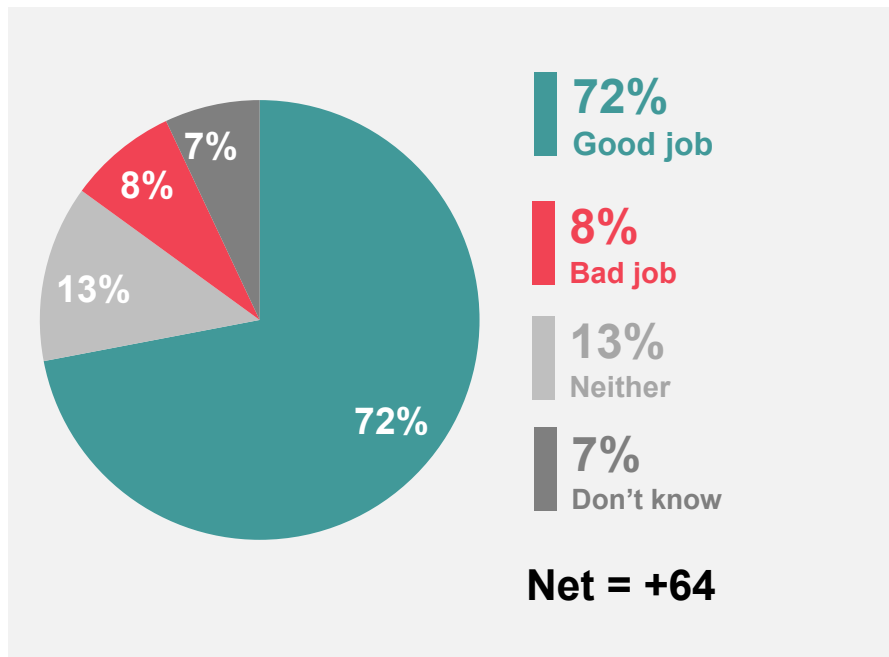

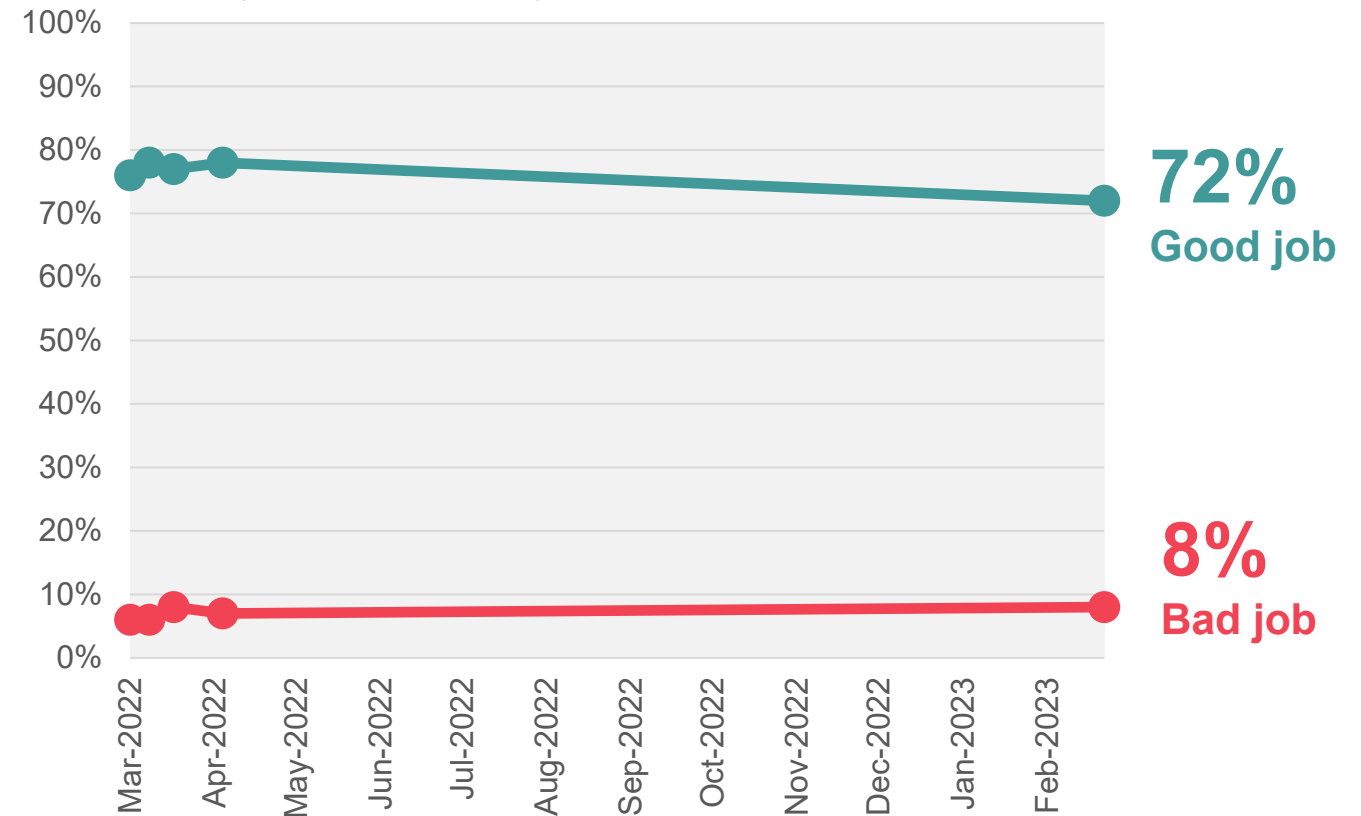

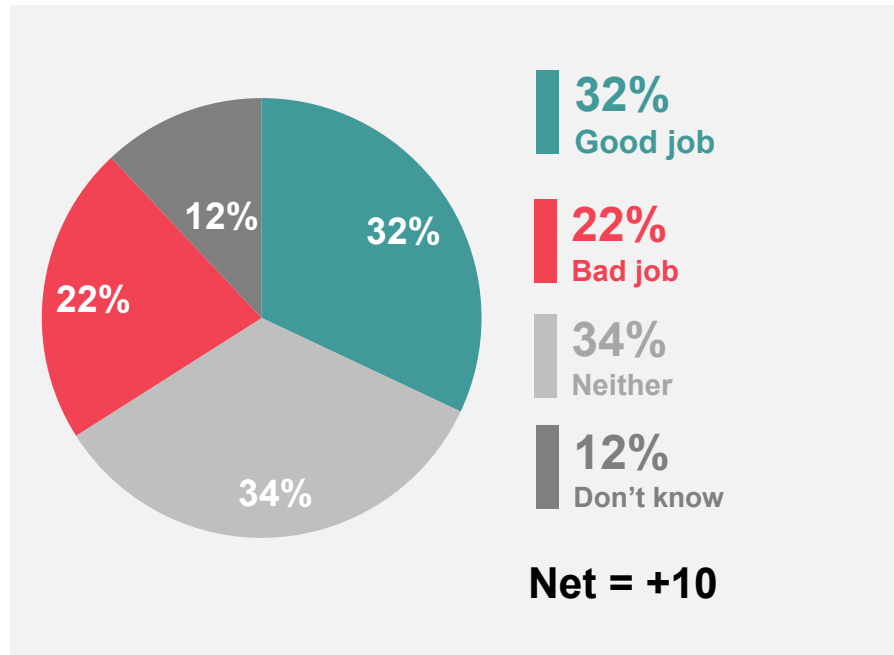

To what extent, if at all, do you think each of the following has done a good or bad job handling the Russian invasion of Ukraine?\* The European Union

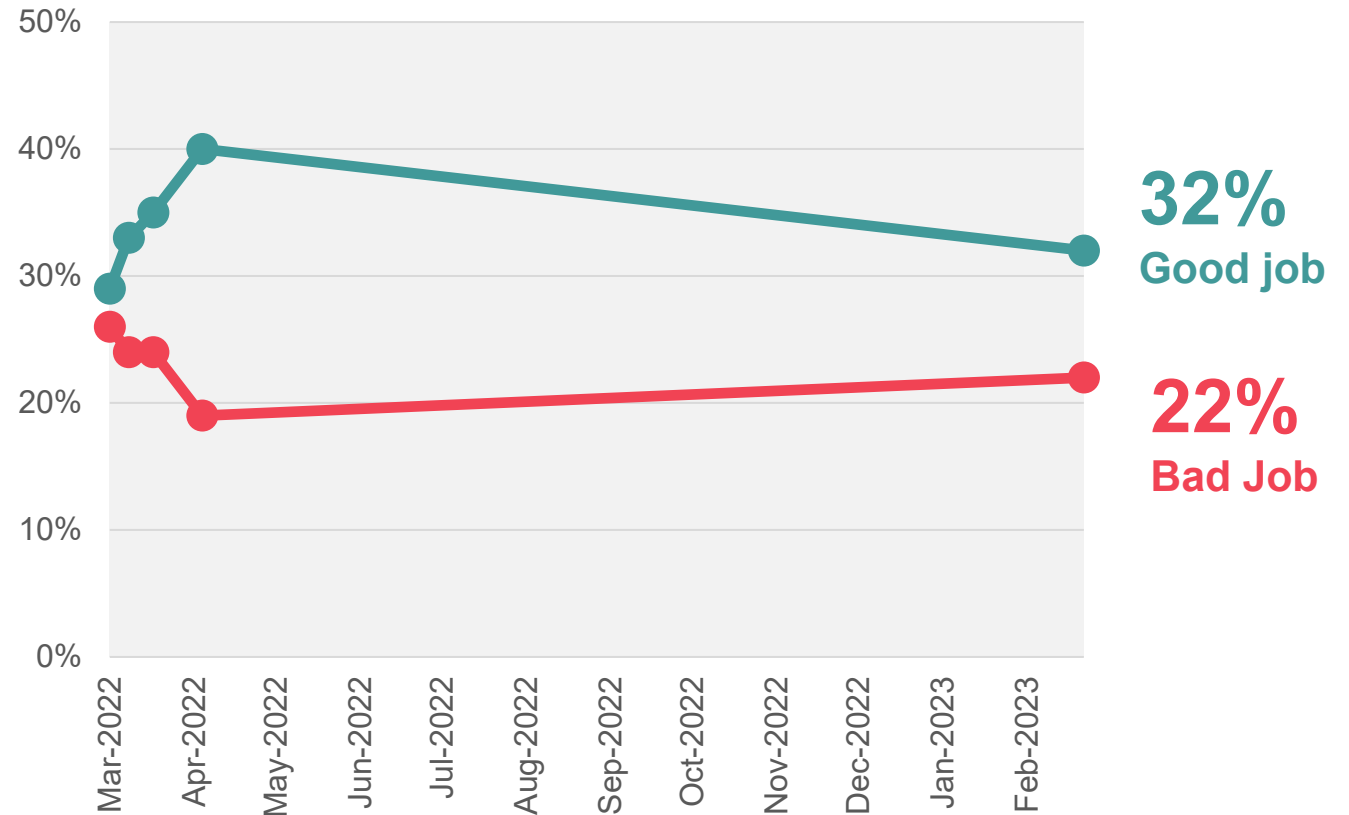

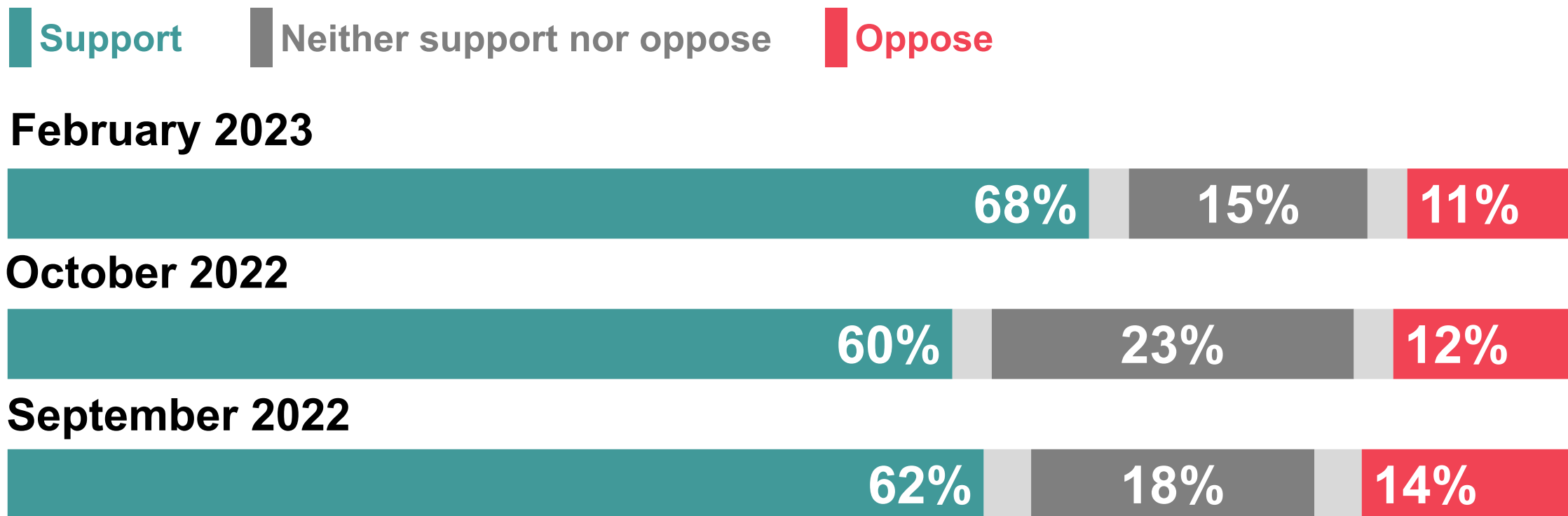




# Two in three support Britain's role in Ukraine, up slightly from last year

As you may know, the UK government is providing a range of economic, humanitarian and defensive military assistance to Ukraine, and is imposing additional sanctions on Russia and Belarus.

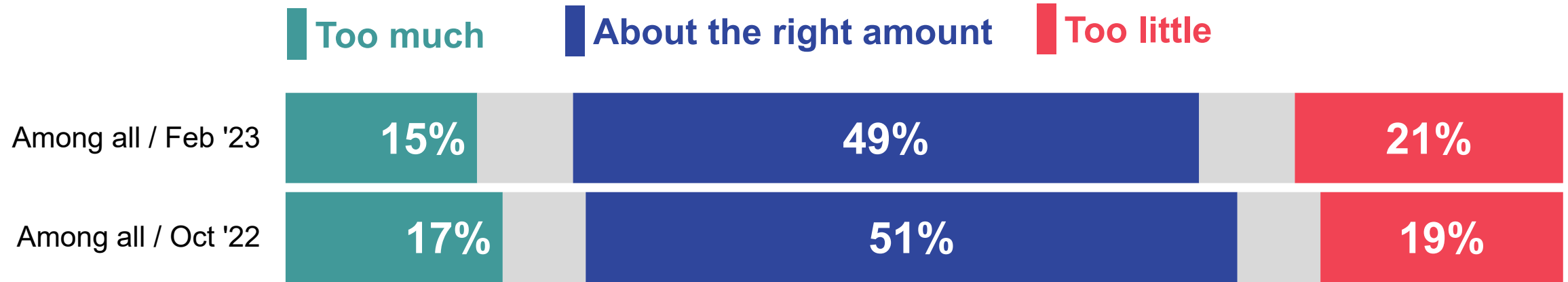
To what extent, if at all, do you support or oppose Britain's current role in the Ukraine conflict?



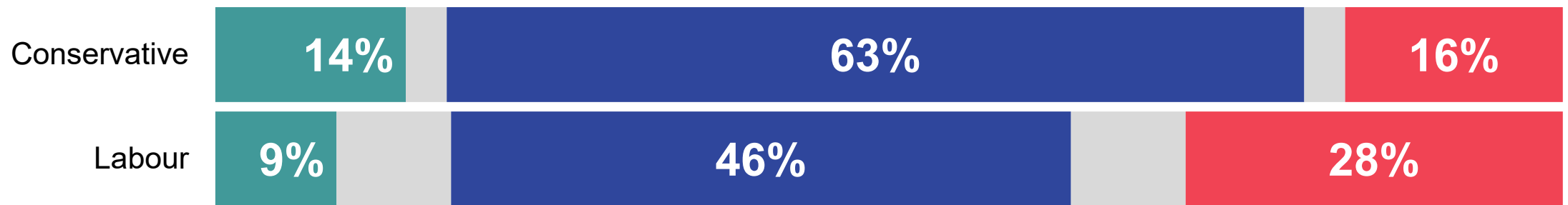

And taking everything into account, do you think the UK has provided too much, too little, or about the right amount of support to Ukraine?



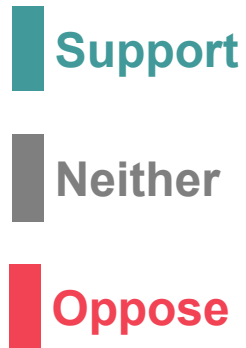
## By 2019 General Election vote

# Support remains high for a range of measures to offer Ukraine assistance during the war

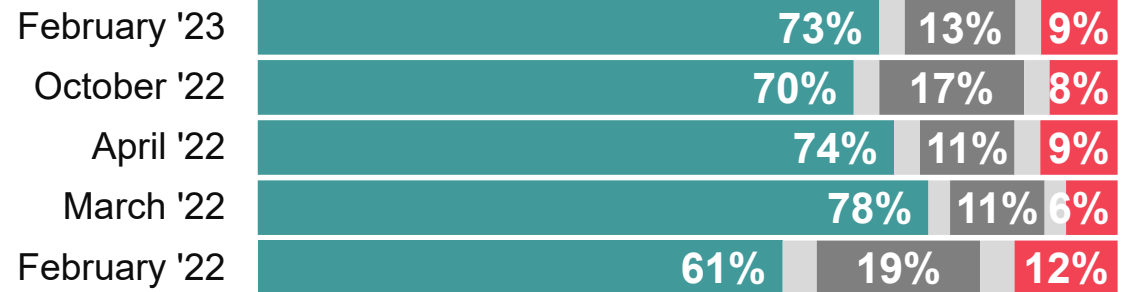
To what extent, if at all, do you support or oppose...?

Economic sanctions on Russia are necessary to support Ukraine and encourage Russia to end the war, even if it means energy and food prices will remain higher for a while

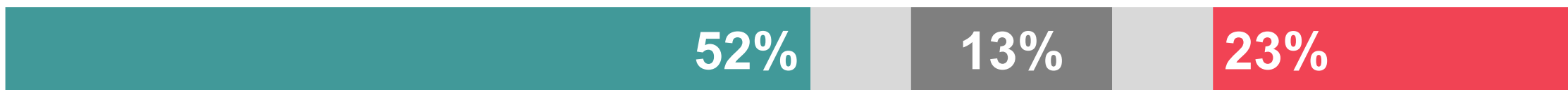
