

To what extent, if at all, do you agree or disagree with the following statements?





To what extent, if at all, do you agree or disagree that Britain needs a fresh team of political leaders in Government?



To what extent, if at all, do you agree or disagree with the following?



To what extent, if at all, do you agree or disagree with the following?



And how confident, if at all, are you that the Labour party can provide the fresh team of political leaders that you think Britain needs?



And how confident, if at all, are you that the Labour party can provide the fresh team of political leaders that you think Britain needs?\*





#### Methods

- Ipsos interviewed a representative quota sample of 1,040 adults aged 16+ in Scotland.
- Interviews took place online between 15<sup>th</sup> March and 26<sup>th</sup> March 2024.
- Data has been weighted to the known offline population proportions.
- Where results do not sum to 100%, this may be due to computer rounding, multiple responses, or the exclusion of "don't know" categories.
- All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error.
