

Generally speaking, do you think things in Scotland are heading in the right direction or wrong direction?





To what extent, if at all, do you have a favourable or unfavourable opinion of the following politicians?






Anas Sarwar: Favourability trend


To what extent, if at all, do you have a favourable or unfavourable opinion of Anas Sarwar, Leader of the Scottish Labour Party?





Keir Starmer: Favourability trend



To what extent, if at all, do you have a favourable or unfavourable opinion of the following politicians and political parties?



To what extent, if at all, do you have a favourable or unfavourable opinion of the following politicians and political parties?














Do you think that the general economic condition of [the UK /Scotland] will improve, stay the same or get worse over the next 12 months?


How confident, if at all, are you that [the Labour Party/the SNP] has a good long-term economic plan for [the UK/Scotland]?

How confident, if at all, are you that the Labour Party has a good long-term economic plan for the UK?








Confidence in Scottish Government plans for the economy

How confident, if at all, are you that the SNP has a good long-term economic plan for Scotland?





Views on Scottish Government performance


Since the Scottish Parliament elections in May 2021, to what extent, if at all, do you think the Scottish Government has done a good or bad job at each of the following?

METHODS

- Ipsos interviewed a representative quota sample of 1,000 adults aged 16+ in Scotland.
- Interviews took place online between 13th September and 18th September 2024.
- Data has been weighted to the known offline population proportions.
- Where results do not sum to 100%, this may be due to computer rounding, multiple responses, or the exclusion of "don't know" categories.
- All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error.
