


The public lacks a strong opinion on Wes Streeting's performance as Secretary of State for Health and Social Care

To what extent, if at all, do you think Wes Streeting has been doing a good or bad job in his role as the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care?



Which of the following statements best describes you?








3 in 10 Britons have heard about weight loss injections, with knowledge decreasing with age

Before today, how much would you say you knew about weight loss injections?



^{*} Note that % me personally and % friends and family do not sum to % yes, as participants could select both





As would be expected, people who consider themselves to be overweight or obese are more likely to have personally taken the injections for weight loss






The public are divided as to whether the NHS should be offering weight loss injections to people who are obese – support increases with self-reported weight



The NHS should not be offering weight loss injections to people who are obese, even if this means that people stay obese








1 in 4 Britons are likely to use weight loss injections in future if they were provided on the NHS, falling to fewer than 1 in 10 who would be likely to pay privately - nearly half of people self-reporting as obese would be likely to, if provided by the NHS
