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Regarding global matters, there's optimism with many expecting the ongoing wars to end in 2025







Regional conflicts will disrupt food supplies to Egypt





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
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A hopeful perspective emerges, with the majority expecting improvements in both mental well-being and physical health compared to 2024







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






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Regarding the environment, the majority foresee rising global temperatures, more extreme weather and parts of the county becoming uninhabitable due to severe conditions





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

Success in achieving 2024 goals set




