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

Reflecting on 2024, nearly half of the individuals viewed the year as challenging for both their families and the country








OVERALL EXPECTATIONS FOR 2025






EXPECTATIONS FOR SOCIETY IN 2025




EXPECTATIONS FOR THE ECONOMY IN 2025








In shopping and finance, the majority predict the dominance of online transactions and digital payments


