

Turning to global matters, a hopeful outlook emerges as many predict that the ongoing wars will end in 2025












EXPECTATIONS FOR THE ECONOMY IN 2025






Outlook on investment and making major purchases



The majority expect tourism to grow, anticipating an increase in visitor numbers to their country next year








Predicted impact of technology on social interaction




Regarding the future of commerce and technology, the majority expect a transition to digital, with online purchases and digital payments becoming the norm





When considering AI and its influence on employment, there is a recognition of its potential to create opportunities while also posing risks to the current employment landscape






Expectations lean towards increased government intervention, where many predict stricter rules for large tech companies to manage their growing power



Sample and methodology

Sample size

3,000 respondents

Sample criteria

General public: age (18+), national representation

Methodology

The survey was conducted via Ipsos online panel, computer aided telephone interviews and computer aided personal interviews

Geographical coverage

Conducted in MENA with a nationwide coverage across: Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Saudi Arabia and UAE



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
